### **The Organization**

Celebrating *Maine's Role in American Art*, the Farnsworth Art Museum offers a nationally recognized collection of works from many of America's greatest artists.

With 20,000 square feet of gallery space and over 10,000 works in the collection, there is always something new on view at the Farnsworth. The museum houses the nation's second-largest collection of works by premier 20th-century sculptor Louise Nevelson. Its Wyeth Center exclusively features works of Andrew, N.C., and Jamie Wyeth.

The Farnsworth's library is also housed in its Rockland, ME campus. Two historic buildings, the Farnsworth Homestead and the Olson House, complete the museum complex.

##### Louisiana Repertory Jazz Ensemble

This nine-piece ensemble formed in New Orleans draws on musical scores, recordings, and historical works in the New Orleans jazz archives of Tulane University. Dedicated to preserving the pre-1930 jazz of New Orleans, the group has performed across the United States. It has toured France and the Soviet Union, and made national television appearances in Italy, Japan, and Sweden. The Ensemble's albums include *Alive and Well* (1981), *Uptown Jazz* (1984), and *Hot & Sweet: Sounds of Lost New Orleans* (1986).
