The Organization

All participants will have the opportunity to hear remarks by LCI's Executive Director, Scott Noppe-Brandon, and a lecture by Maxine Greene, Lincoln Center Institute's Philosopher-in-Residence. Dr. Greene is an engaging and perceptive speaker, with a remarkable ability to make her philosophical reflections accessible to all audiences. As well, additional prominent figures in education may speak during the week.

Workshop leaders (teaching artists and staff) are specially trained by Lincoln Center Institute in the methodology and philosophy of imaginative learning.
